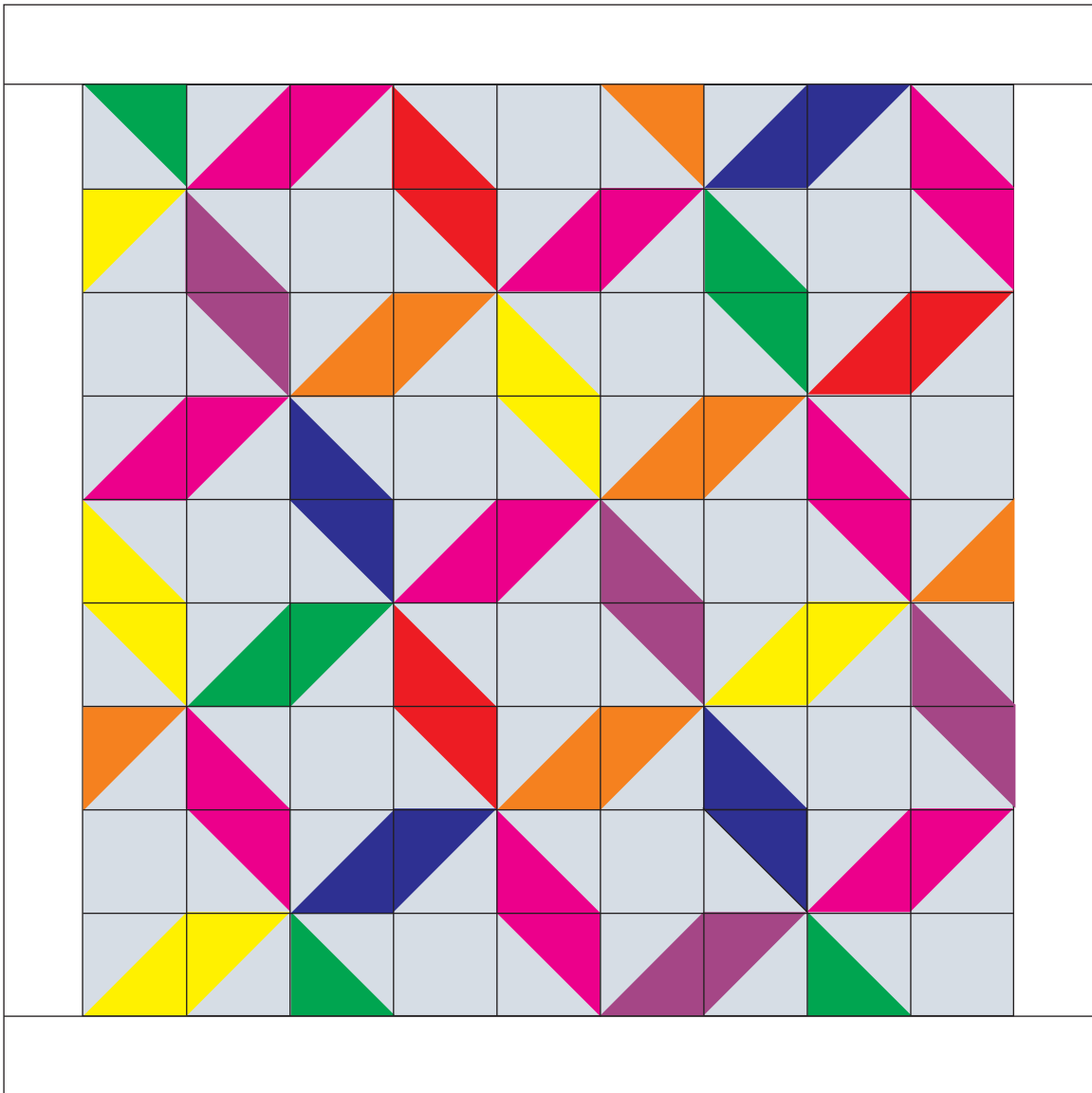


# Windy Day Quilt Pattern

FABRIC NEEDS: 1 LAYER CAKE OR (28) 6" SQUARES FOR THE PINWHEELS - VARIOUS FABRIC/SCRAPS  
1 1/3 YARD CUT INTO (49) 6" SQUARES FOR THE BACKGROUND FABRIC  
(PICTURED LIGHT GREY)  
1 1/3 YARD FABRIC FOR THE BORDER  
1/2 YARD FOR BINDING  
1 1/2 YARD FOR BACKING  
FINISHED SIZE: 57" SQUARE

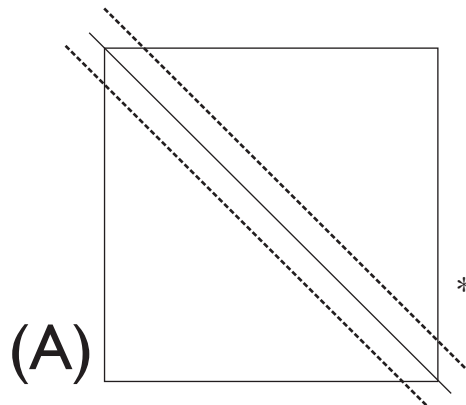

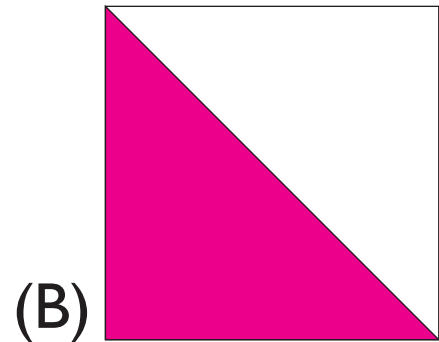
1. AFTER YOU HAVE YOUR 6" SQUARES CUT, PAIR EACH OF YOUR COLORED PIECE FABRICS WITH ONE OF THE BACKGROUND FABRICS, RIGHT SIDES TOGETHER = 33 SETS

2. ON THE BACK OF THE LIGHT FABRIC, DRAW ONE DIAGONAL LINE. REPEAT FOR ALL SETS.

3. TAKE THE SQUARES TO THE MACHINE AND SEW A 1/4" SEAM ON BOTH SIDES OF THE LINE. (SEE FIGURE A)



\*SEW ON DASHED LINE,  
CUT ON SOLID LINE.



4. AFTER SEWING ALL BLOCKS, USE YOUR ROTARY CUTTER AND A RULER TO CUT ON THE DRAWN CENTER LINE THROUGH BOTH LAYERS OF FABRIC. YOU WILL HAVE 66 NEW BLOCKS. (SEE FIGURE B) KEEP LIKE COLORS TOGETHER FOR PIECING.

5. PRESS ALL BLOCKS OPEN WITH SEAMS ALLOWANCE TOWARDS THE DARKER FABRIC.

6. YOUR BLOCKS SHOULD BE 5.5" SQUARE. DOUBLE CHECK AND IF NEEDED, SQUARE UP YOUR BLOCKS TO ALL BE THE EXACT SAME SIZE. YOU WILL WANT TO TRIM YOUR LEFTOVER UNCUT BACKGROUND SQUARES AS WELL.

7. LAY OUT YOUR BLOCKS REFERRING TO THE PICTURE ON PAGE 1.

8. SEW BLOCKS TOGETHER BEING CAREFUL TO KEEP A 1/4" SEAM ALLOWANCE AND KEEP PIECES IN ORDER.

9. CUT 4" BORDER STRIPS.

10. MEASURE LENGTH OF PIECED QUILT AND CUT BORDERS TO THAT LENGTH. SEW ONTO SIDES AND PRESS SEAM TOWARDS BORDER. REPEAT THE PROCESS FOR THE TOP AND BOTTOM EDGES OF THE QUILT.

11. CHOOSE YOUR BATTING AND BACKING, QUILT. TRIM TO ENSURE YOUR QUILT IS SQUARE.

12. PREPARE 232" OF BINDING IN YOUR PREFERRED METHOD, ATTACH AND VOILA!
