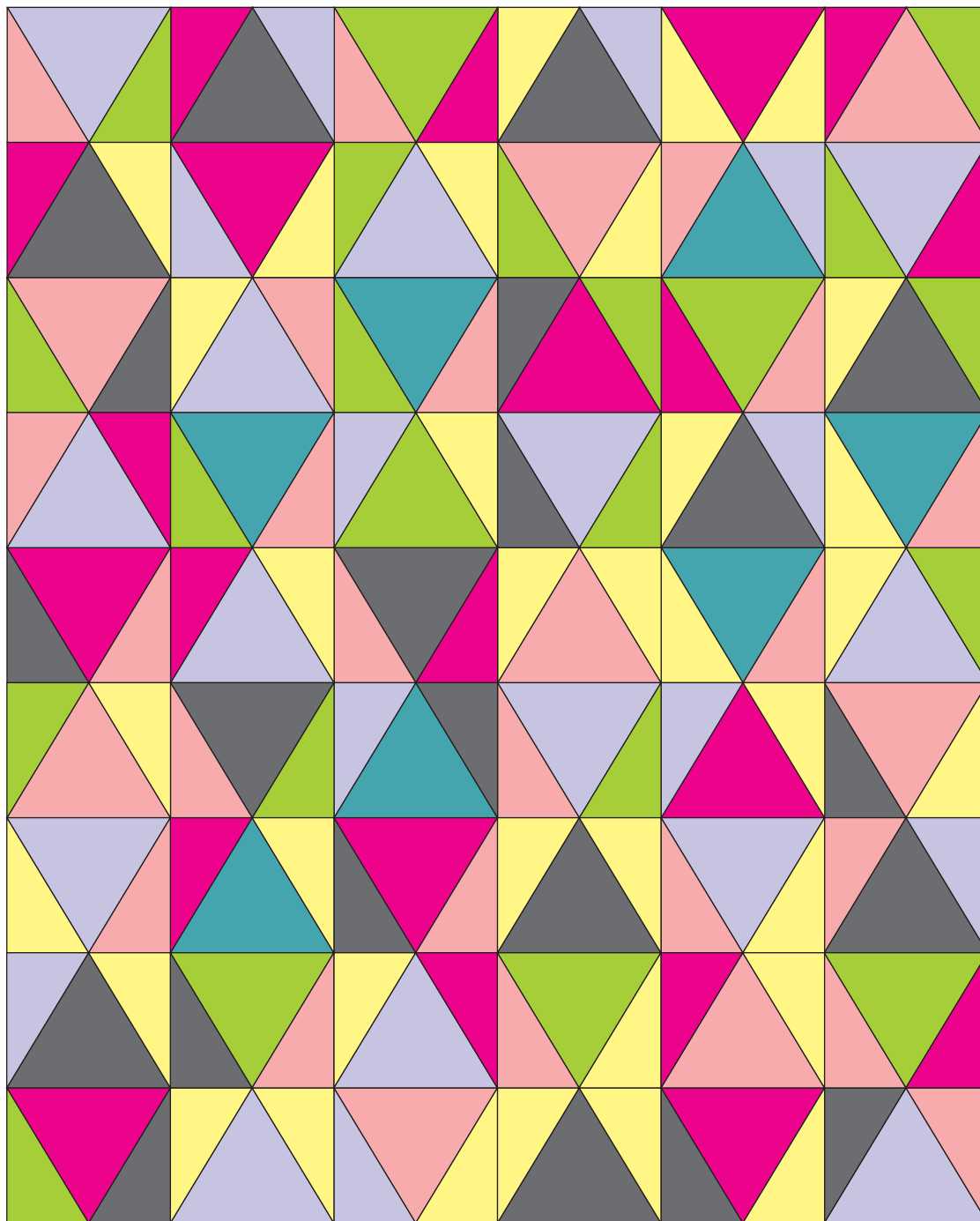
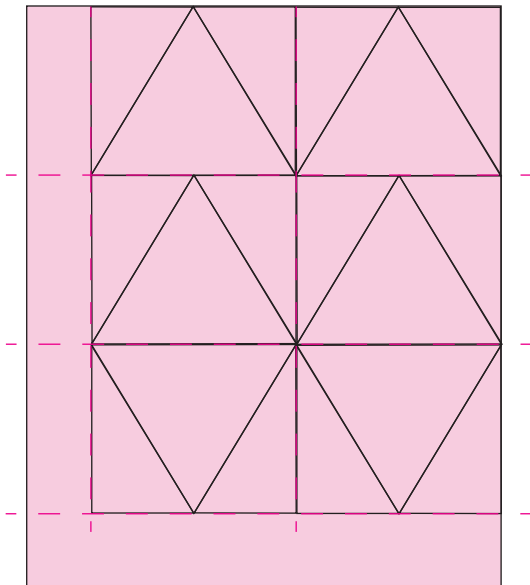


# Easy Triangle Quilt

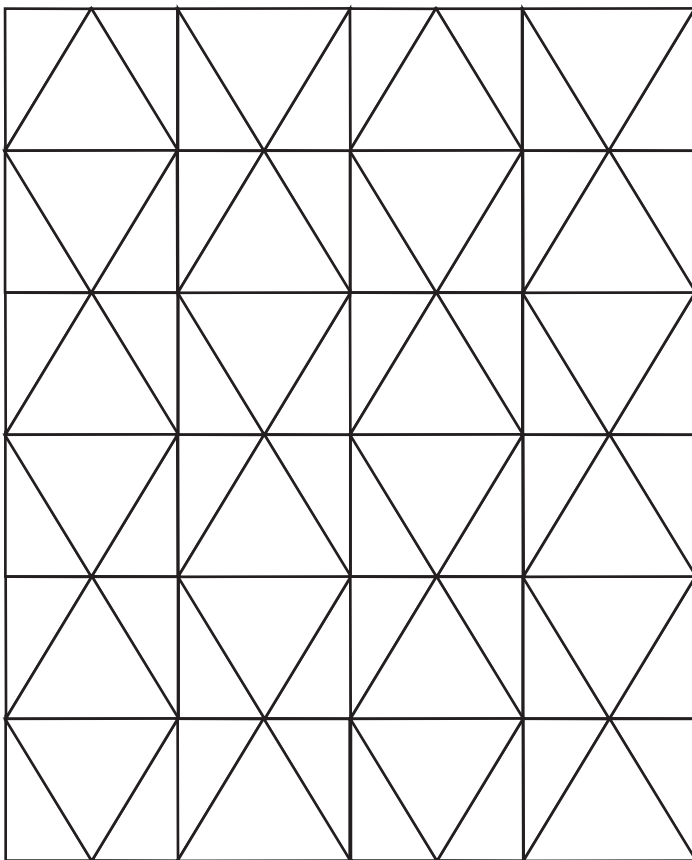




## CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

THIS QUILT IS VERY SCRAP FRIENDLY! IT IS DESIGNED TO WORK WITH A COMBINATION OF FAT QUARTER SIZED FABRICS. THE DIAGRAM TO THE LEFT SHOWS THE MOST EFFICIENT WAY TO CUT YOUR FQS.

MIX & MATCH YOUR PIECES TO DEVELOP THE ALL OVER SCRAPPY LOOK!

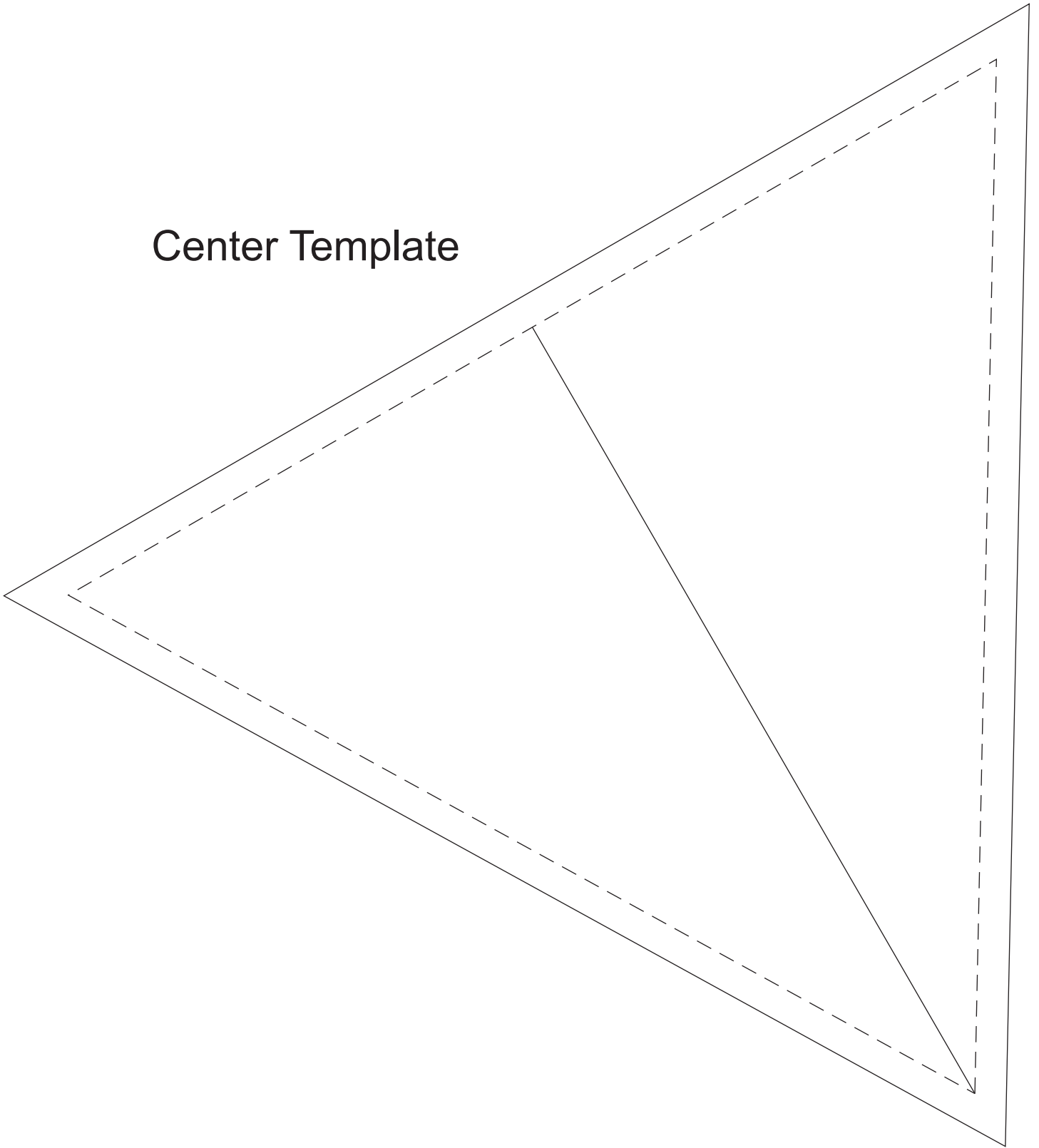


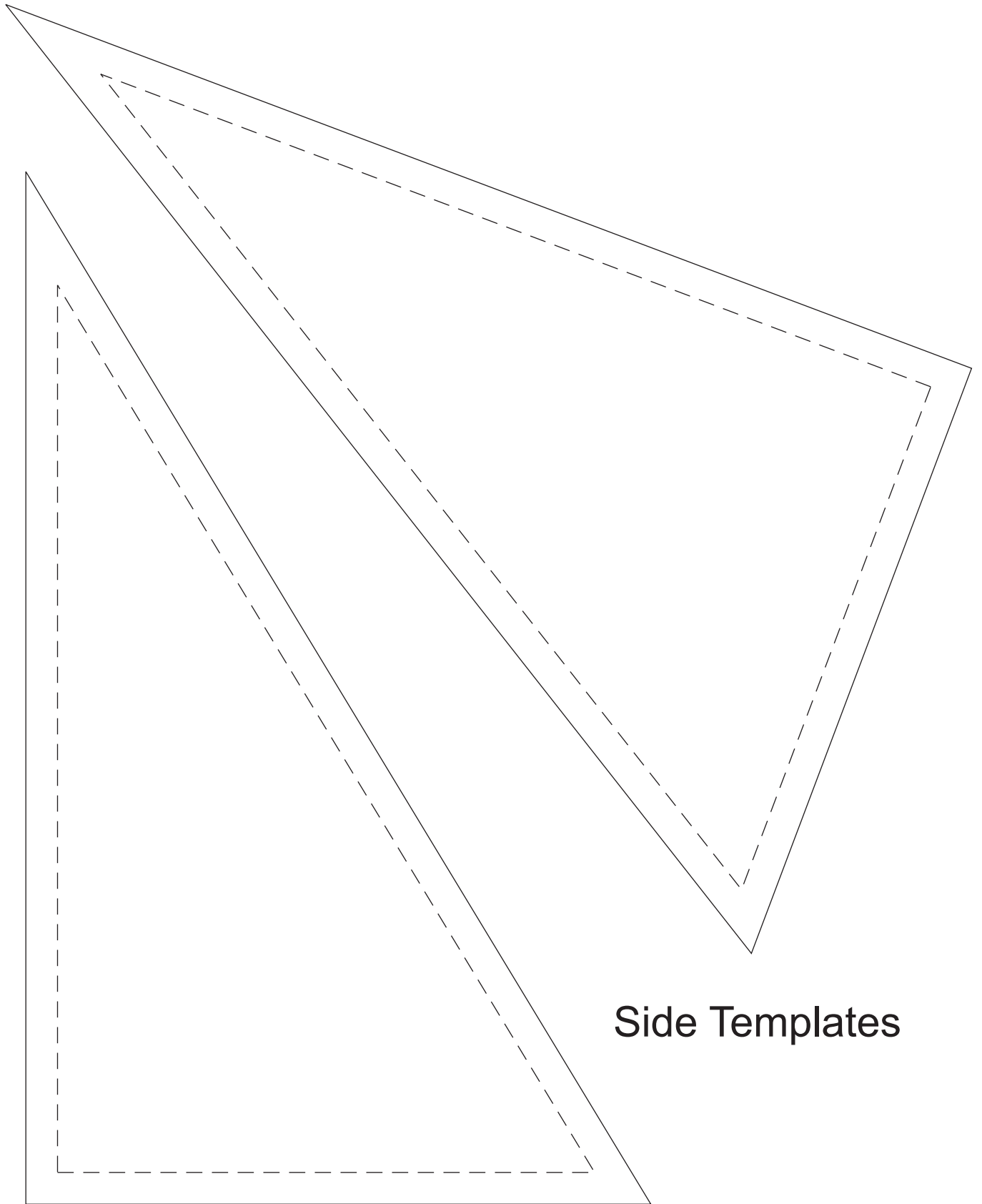
## BABY QUILT 31" X 38"

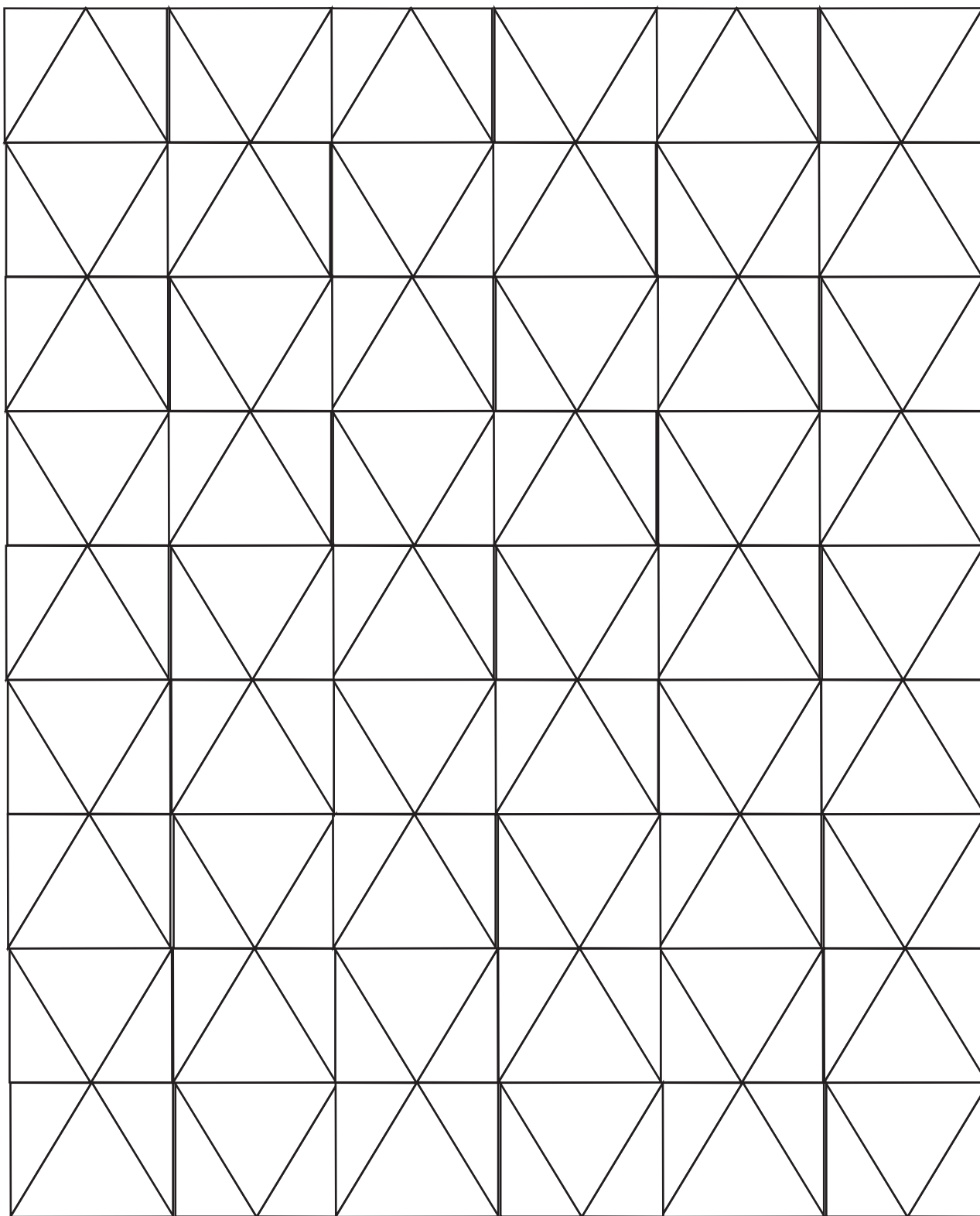

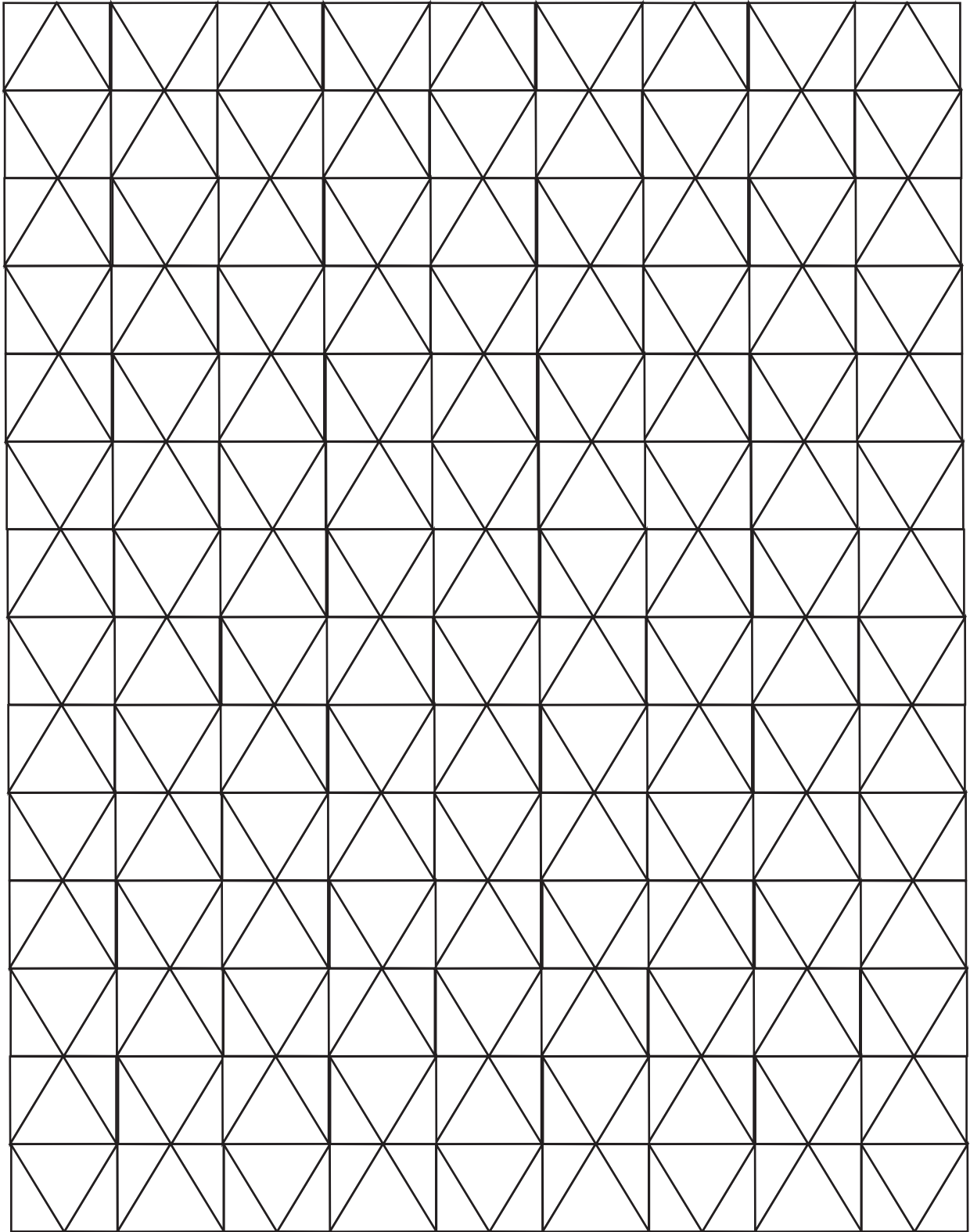

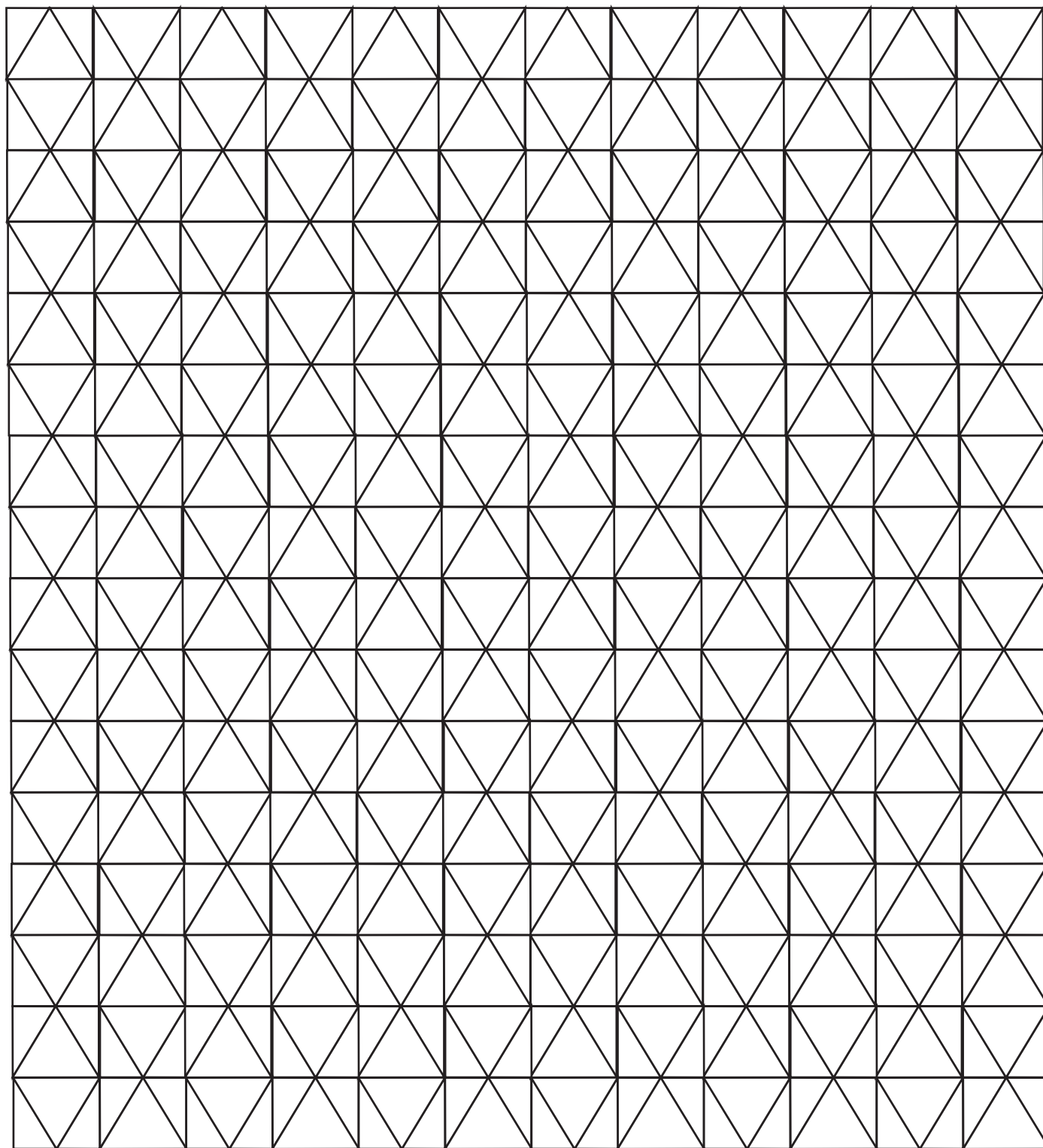
**THROW QUILT 50" X 62"**  
COMBINATION OF (AT LEAST) 9 FAT QUARTERS



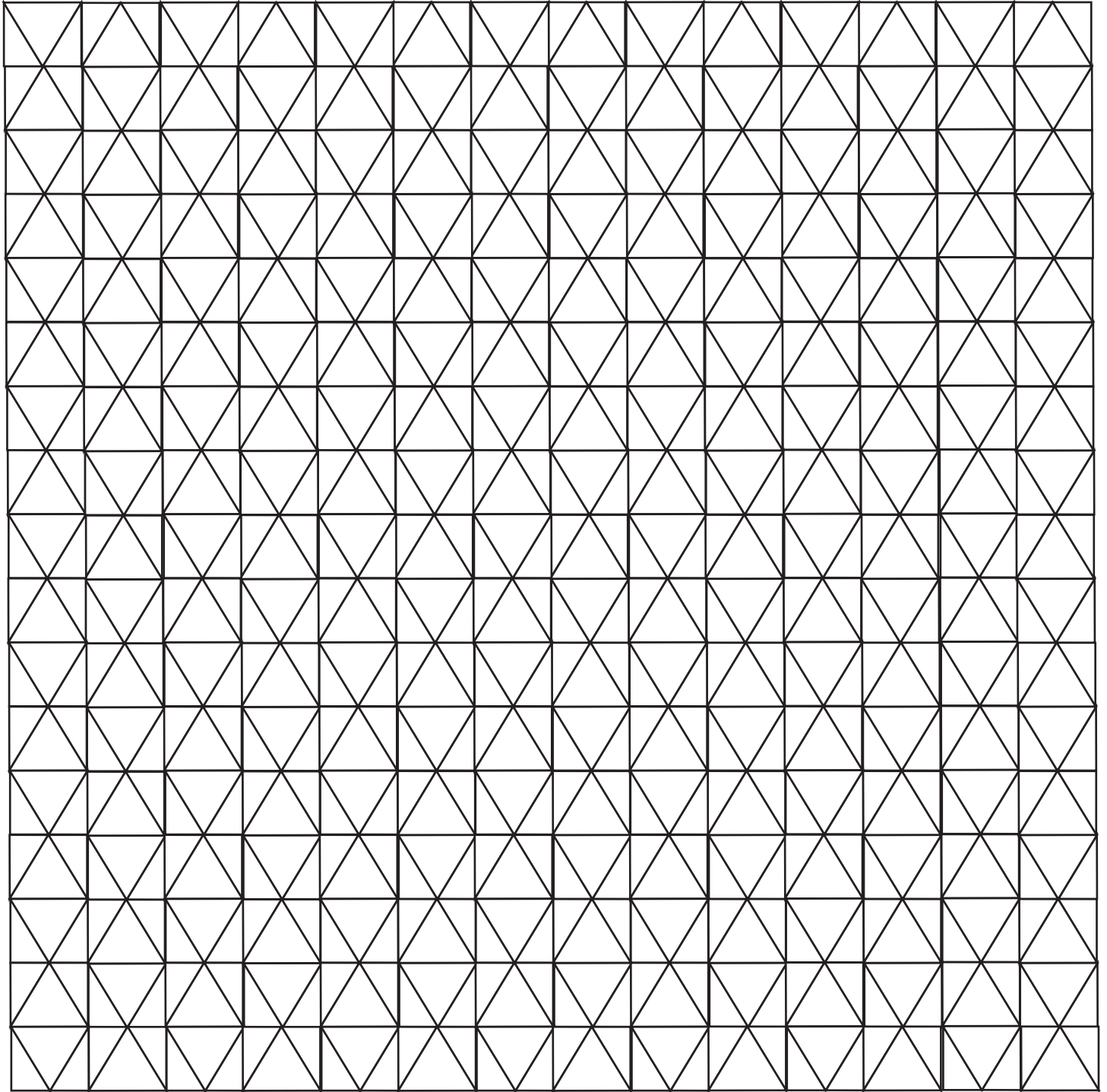
**TWIN QUILT 70" X 90"**

COMBINATION OF (AT LEAST) 40 FAT QUARTERS



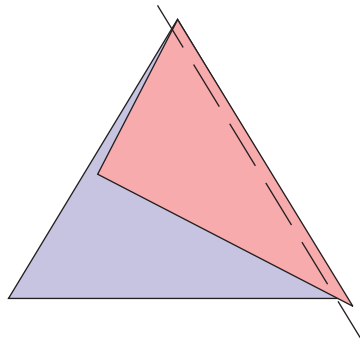


## HOW TO PIECE YOUR BLOCKS

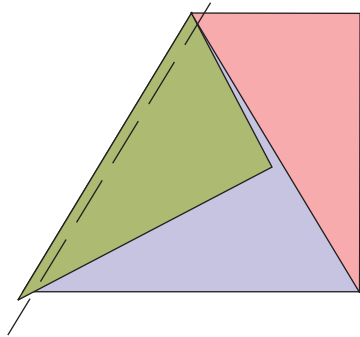
This quilt is a fabulous fabric stash buster! Determine the size of your desired quilt and the number of each piece you will need.

This is a great quilt to use your wild and crazy random fabrics! As far as placement, there are no rules! Just disperse color and patterned fabric over your quilt in a strategic way or... just make it random and let the quilt come together as it does. A triangle quilt does not have to be complicated :)

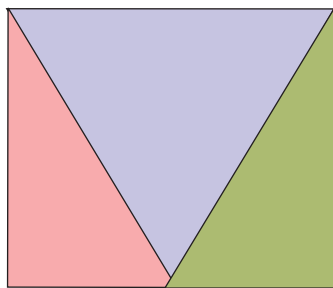

First step is to sew one side piece to your center triangle. Fabrics are right sides together. Start with this point  $\frac{1}{4}$ " over the edge.



Next, sew the second side to your center triangle. Again, start with the point  $\frac{1}{4}$ " over the edge.



This is how your finished piece should look. Notice the  $\frac{1}{4}$ " of cross over at the bottom below the center point. This will come into play when you sew your blocks together and keep your triangle points!

## Assemble the Blocks!

You can also easily change the size of this quilt by adding more blocks around the outside until you reach your desired size.

You can either sew in rows or columns but I recommend picking one and sticking with it for your entire block assembly.

Use a 1/4" seam allowance and make sure your seams are nested!

**What is a nested seam?** - It is when your little seams line up just so and allow for a less errors when sewing. You'll find that it is easier to get those perfectly matched seams and corners. It is a little trick that will change your life! :)
